

contractor's CUE

Working the Room and How to Do It

et's cover an area of working the room with which people often struggle... the actual moving around the room. Disengaging with one group and breaking into groups. Perhaps you have recently had a chance to meet people at a business networking event or social event, a conference, or seminar and have taken the opportunity to go up to someone standing alone. The problem comes when you wish to extricate yourself from this person but don't know how to go about it. If you are both fellow guests at a function you don't owe it to this person to spend the rest of the evening with them. Think about it for a moment, the chances are that this person wishes to move on as much as you do but like you, they simply don't wish to offend or cause any embarrassment.

You can do one of three of things:

- After you have finished speaking you can simply say "Well, it's been great meeting you, enjoy the rest of the evening. Please excuse me as I promised to go and talk to Gerry over there".
- You could say, "I'm going to get another drink, would you like to come?"
- The coward's way out is "Please excuse me, I need to use the restroom!" and make sure you move well away from the person.

Whichever you use please do it with respect, integrity, and politeness. Good manners are essential when working the room and is good business; bad manners bring no business.

The important aspect here is to move around the room with or without your newfound friend. Again, can I remind you that if your conversation is dry, they too probably want to be off working the room as well. You are doing them a favor by using your superior business networking escape techniques!

Using the second idea of moving to the bar is an opportunity to park the person with someone else or for them to park you. It's rare both of you will be at an event where you don't know anyone so moving to the bar usually has the desired effect. When you do bump into someone you know, even though you are a guest at an event act as a host. Don't just say "Hi Lou this is Joe" and leave it there. You have been chatting to Joe for some time and you obviously know Lou ... so play host. Say something like this, "Lou let me introduce you to Joe who I've just met this evening. He has a fascinating business selling sand to Middle Eastern Companies and, Joe, Lou here and I have been friends for years. He runs a business helping growing exporters raise finance from people who are looking for high-ris,k high-return opportunities". These introductions are designed to get the two of them to talk quickly and with ease and reassurance. Who knows what may happen. You just might have created some potential for both. Business networking isn't just about what you can do for yourself, it's about what you can do for others. If you help someone, they will remember you when they hear of someone who needs your services. This of course makes it so much easier for you to move on and meet other people. This exercise is what I call parking. Like your car do it carefully, watch all angles and don't hit anything!

So now you have a parked Joe with Lou you have freshened up your drink. You look around the room and you see clusters of people or groups chatting to each other.

"Help... What do I do next?"

It's easy. Work the room! Look for a group of three people and move over to the edge of the circle. As you are moving towards the group, look at the faces of the people and decide who seems to be the most welcoming. Stand opposite that person at the edge of the group and smile. I can assure you the following will happen. The person you have smiled at will smile back and one or both of the other people will turn towards you and both will take one step to the side making a space for you. When you first do this, it's not easy. I'm not pretending it is but it always works. Ask in a gentle voice "Good evening please may I join you"? Again I have to tell you, you will not be rejected. The chances are someone will put their hand out and introduce themselves. I often play a game at the start of a business networking seminar or prior to a sit down meal by asking my newfound friend if they would allow me to use them as a Guinea Pig. I get them to go up to people they don't know, try out what I have just said and it always works. I do this simply to ensure that whenever I write about the matter or speak about it at the presentations and seminars I deliver that I feel confident in the advice I give.

Once you have successfully joined a group, don't change the subject matter and wait for them to start asking you questions. Bear in mind again, the chances are these people are from the same business or have known each other for a long time but haven't got the self-confidence to break away and meet new people... So you are a big relief for them!

When you are in a group, you will know the time to move on, instinct will tell you. I don't need to. So go to the top of this article and remember the tips about working the room.•

Contractor Technical Questions & the Expert of the Day Program

This edition of the National Fire Sprinkler Magazine (NFSM) is dedicated to addressing common contractor issues. The *Technically Speaking* article is intended to address technical issues. So here we go, let's look at the most common technical questions the National Fire Sprinkler Association (NFSA) receives from our contractor members and how the NFSA *Expert of the Day* (EOD)

program can help address these issues.

The NFSA EOD program reviewed and responded to 1,076 technical questions in 2023. 77% were submitted by contractor members. 72% were related to the sprinkler installation standards including NFPA13, 13R, and 13D. Of the questions posed, obstructions and hazard/commodity classification are the two topics that stood out above all the others. Concealed spaces, exterior projections, hydraulic design areas, fire department connections, storage, and fire pumps round out the other top topics discussed.


For sprinkler obstructions, contractor members are often seeking guidance to apply the prescriptive sprinkler obstruction rules to specific, real life, project conditions. They often provide detailed plan and section views, pictures, and dimensions seeking clarity on how a construction feature will affect a particular sprinkler's spray pattern.

There are several variables that need to be determined to apply the obstruction rules. These include construction type, sprinkler type, maximum deflection distance permitted from the ceiling, minimum/maximum sprinkler spacing/area, type of obstruction (isolated or continuous), how far the obstruction is vertically down from the sprinkler deflector, and how far the obstruction is horizontally from the sprinkler.

Obstructions rules are grouped into several categories. These include performance objectives, obstructions to sprinkler discharge pattern development, suspended and floor mounted obstructions, and obstructions to sprinkler discharge reaching the hazard. The obstruction rules also vary based on the type of sprinkler. For example, the rules for standard spray pendent sprinklers are different from those for extended coverage or residential sprinklers.

The *Expert of the Day* collaborates with members to consider all the variables that affect sprinkler obstructions, review the requirements of the standard, and provide options to confirm compliance. This can ensure effective sprinkler discharge pattern development, which will properly reach the hazard, control the fire, and provide an efficient installation for the contractor. For more information on this topic, see *NFSA TechNotes* issue #490 dated June 28, 2022.

For hazard and commodity classification, contractor members are often looking for guidance on how to classify hazards and commodities that are not



specifically included as examples in the annex. The standard itself is purposely vague and open to interpretation. Hazard classification terms include low, moderate, high, and very high to describe the quantity and combustibility of contents. Without a specific example in the annex, like offices, residential, restaurant service area, and automobile parking, it is difficult to ensure the proper classification.

For this reason, the NFSA and our industry partners agree that hazard and commodity classification is the most important aspect of fire protection system design and a primary obligation of the responsible design professional. The responsible design professional ensures that the site-specific attributes of the project are recognized and properly addressed, which cannot be accomplished in a generic manner in the standard.

The *Expert of the Day*, while certainly not the responsible design professional for your project, collaborates with members to review how their specific project may or may not match the quantity and combustibility of contents of the examples provided in the standard. Your EOD can also provide additional background and insight into NFPA committee first and second draft meeting discussions. For more information on this topic, see *NFSA TechNotes* issue #492 dated July 26, 2022.

The built environment is constantly changing and evolving. Unfortunately, the codes and standards are slow to respond. Sprinkler contractors constantly face technical challenges as they apply the codes and standard to their projects. The question becomes not just how to answer the technical question at hand, but rather, where and how to continuously find the best resources?


Ideally, all of us want to hire only the best educated, experienced, and certified design professionals. But let's be honest, this simply is

As an NFSA member, another option is the utilization of the EOD program.

It is not possible for sprinkler contractors to manage their dayto-day business while remaining intimately involved in all the codes and standards. This is exactly why your NFSA membership is so valuable. With 85 staff members representing the industry on over 285 codes and standards committees, we are always ready to provide clarification and sound expertise. To take advantage of this firsthand codes and standards development knowledge, please



use the EOD process, our top member benefit.

You can submit an EOD question on the NFSA web site using your account. Simply fill in the information including the code or standard and ask your question. It will be reviewed by one of our subject matter experts and returned within one business day.

NFSA Tech Notes is published twice a month. One includes the best dozen EOD questions and answers from the previous month. In addition, the NFSA publishes the *EOD Handbook*. This includes 1,530 pages with 2,288 questions on 745 topics in a three-volume set covering EOD questions from 2004 to 2020. A fourth volume has been just been released including an additional 228 pages with 200 questions from 2021 and 2022. If you have a question, there is an exceptionally good chance someone else has had the same question. The answer will be found in these

handbooks.

Sprinkler contractors face numerous technical challenges in their daily operations, including system design complexities, equipment installation issues, and code compliance requirements. The NSFA EOD program provides valuable technical resources and expertise to help contractors address these challenges effectively. Permits for Repairs?

A permit is permission by the local Authority Having Jurisdiction (AHJ) to proceed on a project when the construction documents are in order and fees are paid. Permits may be required by the fire codes such as NFPA 1 *Fire Code* Section 1.13 and Table 1.13.8, and the *International Fire Code* (IFC) Section 105 for various purposes including new construction and existing building operations

like high-pile storage. Construction permits are typically issued to contractors, while operational permits are issued to owners.

Construction Permits

Construction permits are not necessary for repairing previously approved automatic fire sprinkler systems. Repairing an existing approved automatic sprinkler system, as defined in NFPA 1 Section 1.3.6.2 and IFC Section 105.1.5, aims to restore it to sound working condition or fix damage, such as that caused by an impairment like leaking sprinklers/piping or damaged valves. Repairing these items with similar components to put the system back in order is allowed as per the fire codes (NFPA 1 Section 1.3.6.3 and 13.1.7 and IFC Section 105.1.5), which means compliance with specific fire code, corresponding building codes International Building Code (IBC), International Existing Building Code (IEBC), installation standards (NFPA 13, etc.), life safety code (NFPA 101), NFPA 25, and the equipment/devices' listing is necessary. The IBC explicitly states in Section 105.6.2 that maintenance according to the code does not require a permit, but installation of new or modification of existing does.

Repair Definitions and Use

Repair, as defined in NFPA 25 and in Chapter 2 of the IBC, refers to the reconstruction or renewal of any part of maintenance or to correct damage. Construction documents and plan reviews are not required for repairs, as well as construction permits are unnecessary because replacing previously approved components with similar ones does not alter system performance or approval. For instance, if a section of grooved 3-inch Schedule 10 black steel pipe is damaged, the repair would involve replacing it with a similar or like section of the same size and type.

Testing Repaired Components

NFPA 25 mandates testing of the repaired components, but unlike original installation acceptance testing, notification to the AHJ is not necessary. NFPA 25, Section 4.6.5 requires the repaired portion to comply with the summary of component action requirement tables, such as Table 5.5.1 for fire sprinklers. While NFPA 1 Section 13.1.1 allows AHJ presence during full acceptance tests, existing systems have already undergone such testing, as outlined in Section 1.3.6.2. The IFC has similar language.

Notification for Repairs

Notification of an impaired system and system shutdown for repair is the responsibility of the owner or impairment coordinator, as required by NFPA 1, Section 13.1.2, IFC Section 901.7.1, and NFPA 25 Section 15.2. Licensed contractors, or those who are qualified, are responsible for taking down, repairing, testing, and putting the system back in service. Owners are responsible for necessary notifications, as outlined in NFPA 25, Section 15.5.2, preplanned impairment programs, for repairs before implementing fire watch or other mitigations.

Summary

In summary, a construction permit is not required for repairing or maintaining an automatic sprinkler system. While requiring an operational permit is the AHJ's prerogative, any conditions, such as local ordinances mandating construction permits for repairs, should be consistent across the jurisdiction to ensure a level playing field for all contractors and owners.•

DELAWARE Sprinkler Save at Rehab Center

Thanks go to the Delaware Fire Sprinkler Coalition's Chairperson Paul Eichler for sharing this sprinkler save.

The Delaware Office of the State Fire Marshal investigated a structure fire that occurred in Millsboro, Delaware on January 25, 2024, shortly after 9:30pm. The Indian River Volunteer Fire Company arrived on the scene and found smoke showing from a structure at a rehabilitation center.

The fire was determined to be accidental in nature, originating on the interior of the structure in a mechanical room. The fire was caused by an unspecified electrical malfunction at an electrical power strip. The fire was contained by the building's automatic fire sprinkler system. Damage is estimated at \$2500. There were no reported injuries.

Fire Sprinkler System Saves Apartment Complex

Thanks to the Delaware Fire Sprinkler Coalition's Paul Eichler and Wilmington Battalion Chief Robert F. Pryor for sending us this sprinkler save!

On February 6th at 2240 hours, the Wilmington Fire Department responded to an apartment complex for a report of a structure fire. First arriving companies reported smoke showing from the third-floor stairwell of the four-story, wood frame building.

Firefighters entered the structure and found a fire in a third-floor apartment being controlled by the building's fire sprinkler system. The fire department completed extinguishment of a small fire in the bedroom and secured the sprinkler system.

Due to the quick action of the building's sprinkler system, the apartment where the fire occurred only sustained minor fire and smoke damage. Most of the building's residents were able to return to their apartments shortly after the fire was placed under control, approximately 15 minutes after the arrival of the fire department. There were no civilian or fire department injuries.

ILLINOIS

Single Sprinkler Save Apartment Complex

Thanks to Elk Grove Village, IL Fire Marshal Jason Staidl for this most excellent report of a sprinkler save!

On Monday, March 4, 2024, at 16:53 hrs., the Elk Grove Village Fire Department responded to an activated fire alarm at an apartment complex. Upon arrival, crews observed no visible signs of smoke or fire from all sides of the building, and occupants were already self-evacuating. Crews determined that the alarm activation originated from the third floor.

As crews entered the third floor, they found no visible signs of smoke or fire but encountered moderate amounts of water in the hallway. Due to the water, crews pinpointed the unit from which it originated. Upon entering the unit, crews discovered a small "extinguished" fire that had originated on the stove top, activating a single (1) fire sprinkler.

The occupant(s) of the unit were not home during the fire; all other residents safely evacuated with no reported injuries. Since the fire was contained to a single unit, only the occupant(s) of that unit were displaced, leaving

79 of the buildings 80 units unaffected.

The presence of this early detection system played a crucial role in preventing a potential total loss of the building and its contents. Thanks to its timely activation, damages were minimized, and the complex experienced minimal disruption to its operations.

The Elk Grove Village Fire Department is proud to share the story of this "Sprinkler Save" incident, showing the invaluable benefits of automatic sprinkler systems in safeguarding lives and property. Following a comprehensive fire investigation, Elk Grove Village Fire Investigators have determined the fire to be accidental in nature.

INDIANA

Apartment Fire Controlled by Sprinkler System

Thanks to Valparaiso, IN Division Chief Tim Stites for sending us this sprinkler save.

On February 17th, the Valparaiso FD responded to the report of a structure fire. The call was initiated via a landline call to Valparaiso Fire Station One from a person on the fourth floor of the four-story residential over-commercial building stating that the fire alarm was going off.

Upon arrival, firefighters found no active fire but found a single sprinkler had contained a kitchen fire in a second-floor apartment. An occupant was asleep in a bedroom of the unit when the fire occurred. She escaped safely with her dog.

No injuries were reported.

Two Fire Sprinklers Extinguish Fire at Container Management Business

Thanks to Gregg Simpson of the Wayne Township Fire Department in Indiana for sending us this sprinkler save.

This is a warehouse that is full of plastic containers. These folks had a squatter living way back in this small aisle between the stacks. Unsure what started the fire but as you can see the fire was well on its way to burning down this building when the sprinklers activated and saved the building. The fire hit the ceiling right between 2 fire sprinklers, one to the left and right, setting both off.



MAINE

"Middle of the Night" Fire Contained by Sprinkler System

Thank you to Fire Inspector Marc Veilluex of the Office of the Maine State Fire Marshal for reporting this sprinkler save.


On March 8th, the South Portland, ME Fire Department responded to Southern Maine Community College (SMCC), having been alerted by the campus's fire alarm system.

Upon arrival, crews discovered that the automatic sprinkler system had activated, containing a fire in the Sea Wolves Café. Damage to the building was minor, and the fire did not extend beyond the initially ignited contents. The Sea Wolves Café is in the SMCC Campus Center where several student services are located. According to Fire Chief Phil Selberg, without the activation of the sprinkler system, damage to the building could have been substantial, and the entire campus would have been disrupted substantially. "This fire occurred in the middle of the night when no one was in the building to discover it. The sprinkler system worked as it was designed and saved the Campus Center. Automatic sprinkler systems in commercial and residential buildings continue to save lives and property, and we strongly advocate for their installation."

MINNESOTA

Mom, Baby, and Apartment Complex Safe-Thanks to a Single Fire Sprinkler

Thanks to Inspector Jason Albers of the Eden Prairie, MN FD for sending in this sprinkler save.





On February 22nd, an apartment resident saw smoke coming from dryer while doing a load of laundry. When she opened the door, to see where the smoke was coming from, flames came out of the dryer.

The resident attempted to extinguish the flames with a fire extinguisher but was not successful. She then evacuated with her baby. A single fire sprinkler located on the adjacent wall of the laundry room activated and contained the flames.

NEW JERSEY

Warehouse Sprinkler Save

Thanks to Manalapan, NJ Assistant Chief Tom Kirkland for reporting this sprinkler save.


On February 5th, Manalapan Township Fire Company 1 was dispatched 6:49pm to a mixed-use building with business and storage use groups. for an automatic fire alarm (water flow). The area of the incident was in the warehouse portion of the building.

Arriving crews were met with water flowing from the building and a heavy smoke condition on the interior. After searching they had found the fire in the warehouse with activated fire sprinklers flowing. After ventilation firefighters were able to see the activated sprinkler at the ceiling which kept the fire contained to contents on the rack storage units.

TEXAS

Single Sprinkler Saves Apartment Complex

Thanks to Farmers Branch, TX Fire Inspector Brandon Laird for submitting this sprinkler save.





On February 28th, at approximately 1:50pm, the Farmers Branch FD responded to a Multi-Family Fire Alarm. On arrival, Firefighters discovered a single fire sprinkler controlled a fire in the kitchen.

The single sprinkler activation contained the fire to the area of origin and ultimately extinguished the fire.

WASHINGTON

Single Sprinkler Extinguishes Kitchen Fire

Thanks to Marysville, WA Fire Department Fire Marshal Tom Maloney and longtime NFSA member for sharing this great save!





When Marysville Fire District responded to an apartment fire on March 14, they arrived to find light smoke coming from a second-floor unit.

A kitchen microwave fire had been suppressed by one fire sprinkler. Firefighters only need to finish the extinguishment with "minimal use of water" and perform an overhaul to check for any fire extension. No injuries were reported.

The sprinkler system was credited with containing the damage to the subject property with water damage to the unit directly below. Total damage is estimated under \$40,000.

WISCONSIN

Single Fire Sprinkler Extinguishes Apartment Kitchen Fire

Thanks to Madison, WI Fire Marshal Bill Sullivan for sending in this sprinkler save!

On February 18th, Madison firefighters were called to an apartment building on Madison's West side for the report of fire alarms sounding and a smoke odor in the hallway.

Upon arrival, crews found one fire sprinkler had extinguished a

kitchen fire in an apartment. Firefighters worked to ventilate the smoke odor, and the investigation is ongoing. No one was home at the time of the fire.

Single Fire Sprinkler Saves Apartment Building

Thanks to Fitchburg, WI Division Chief Mark Mlekush for sending us this sprinkler save.

On January 24th, Fitchburg firefighters responded to an alarm at an apartment building. The first arriving crews did not see visible smoke and flames. After assessing the property, personnel were able to locate a contained fire in the entrance to a second-floor apartment. The building's fire sprinkler system contained the fire in the affected apartment.

From Chief Mlekush:

The fire was accidental, the result of incense left burning while the occupants were out of the unit for about 45 min to one hour. The sidewall fire sprinkler, installed in 1996, was an ordinary hazard sprinkler and appears to have discharged at its rated temp of 155°. The incense fell onto a carboard box that was to be taken to the dumpster. A stroller that was in the area was also damaged. There was no structural, or cosmetic damage, only water and the objects directly involved with the ignition were damaged. The second unit affected was water seepage under the wall, and minimal – That resident was allowed back into their apartment immediately. I estimate total damage to be approximately \$5000 after the cleanup is complete.

WYOMING

Residential Fire Sprinkler Saves Apartment

Thanks to Worland, WY FD Fire Chief Chris Kocher for sending us this sprinkler save.

In the early afternoon of February 23rd, the Worland Fire Department responded to a report of a water flow fire alarm at a two-story multi-family residential complex. Upon arrival crews found water flow coming from one unit.

While investigating, firefighters found the remains of a small fire in a closet that the activation of a single fire sprinkler had suppressed. Firefighters were able shut the fire sprinkler system down, replaced the sprinkler, and ensure a licensed fire sprinkler contractor was notified. The system was back in operation within one hour of the call.

The fire damage was minimal and the residents should be back in the unit in a few days. The other building residents were not displaced. There were no injuries.•



Contractor Challenges

Labor Force

Finding a good labor force in the construction industry can be challenging for many reasons and can be especially difficult for the fire sprinkler industry. Many of our qualified laborers are starting to retire and with no one to fill these positions, it has become increasingly difficult to meet the demands of customers.

Since the fire sprinkler industry often faces shortages of skilled labor, this can lead to increased competition for contractors, as well as increased costs to the end user. Under certain circumstances, this can lead to cutting corners. In this article we will discuss some of these reasons.

Industry Promotion

Unless someone is going to college to obtain a degree in fire protection or working in their family business, most people "fall into" the industry. Currently, there are four major fire protection engineering universities that produce approximately 100 graduates per year. But, for most positions in the fire protection industry a degree is not necessary.



Many of us have found our way into the fire sprinkler industry by the need for employment, or a friend of ours connected us to the industry. There are very few vocational schools that address or promote the sprinkler trade. In some areas of the country, contractors and associations will attend career day type events. This typically has little to no impact on students' decisions on what they want to do after they graduate. Often, they are typically introduced through another trade, such as plumbing.

Other Factors

The last few generations have told their children that the only way to make money and have a good productive career is to go to college. The construction trades are often looked down on and frequently these workers are considered not as intelligent or lacking the qualifications for higher paying positions.

Safety concerns are always a topic of discussion within the construction industry as construction sites are inherently hazardous. Fair wages and benefits are also another topic at the top of an employee's list, this is especially true when someone is new or "green" in the industry. In many cases, new employees do not receive health insurance and paid leave for a period after starting a new position.

Access to education and training opportunities may not be offered for several years depending on the position and location. Construction work can be physically demanding and stressful leading to injuries, fatigue, and in some cases, mental health disorders.

Retention

Once an employer can find reliable labor, retaining them can be a cumbersome task. There are many factors that go into retaining an employee. Some of these factors can include but are not limited to:

- Fair wages
- Benefits
- Workplace environment
- Education and training
- Technical support

Even when an employer provides all these items, it does not guarantee that they will be able to retain their staff. With the shortage of workers in the industry, it is known that an employee can typically find new employment within a few days. There is no easy solution for this, as sometimes employees will leave for the greener grass, or what appears to be greener.

Retaining qualified and certified employees is based on pay and training. Training employees is needed to meet the requirements of the Authority Having Jurisdiction (AHJ) to obtain qualifications. Often, once the training is completed, or if no training is provided, an employee may leave for better pay or to find better training.

Another factor in retaining employees is resource constraints such as limited budgets which impact the ability to purchase or maintain vehicles, tools, and other equipment. This impacts the ability to retain employees.

Training and Certification

Through state or local laws, the AHJ designates who is qualified to perform the install, repair, and inspections of fire protection systems. This training can be provided in many ways, such as apprenticeship, in class, on the job, and virtual. The type of training will often be dictated by the type of work the employee will be conducting, often requiring recertification.

Depending on the requirements, obtaining these qualifications can be challenging. Technicians and fitters must undergo many hours, and in some cases years, of training to obtain qualifications and certifications. They must also stay updated with the evolving technologies and changes in codes and standards.

Summary

Addressing these challenges requires a collaborative effort involving the AHJ, employers, and other stakeholders. Programs such as the *Future Builders of America* are necessary to promote the fire protection industry. By implementing comprehensive policies and practices, it is possible to improve the labor pool within the fire protection industry. This is not something that can be left to "others" to do, we as an industry must work together to make it happen.•




The Fire Sprinkler Concept Makes a Splash at the International Builders Show

SFPE Foundation Publishes Report on Integration of Building Information Modeling with Fire Protection Systems, Software, and Workflows


The SFPE Foundation announces a new report that examines Building Information Modeling (BIM), in relation to the fire engineering landscape.

The Integration of Building Information Modeling with Fire Protection Systems, Software, and Workflows is the culmination of a year-long research project led by Stephen B. Roth, PE, President and Chief Technology Officer of Carmelsoft. When the Foundation awarded a research grant to Roth, he set out to investigate BIM software tools and schemas available to fire engineers (FEs).

Through interviewing over 40 stakeholders, Roth learned that improvements could be made to software, data, and interoperability to enhance the design experience and expand BIM adoptionamongst FEs. Roth's recommendations include that equipment manufacturers design more usable Revit families and that updates be made to the IFC (Industry Foundation Classes) schema for better interoperability. The report also explores the future of BIM in fire engineering, which includes adoption of artificial intelligence tools and digital twins of physical buildings for smarter firefighting.

Accompanying the report is a supplementary User Guide that includes expectations and recommendations on overcoming some of the workflow bottlenecks that occur when fire engineers are using FE-related software tools. Readers who wish to focus on the practical application of the research should check out the User Guide first.

Tagging for Success

In 2024, the Tagging for Success journey began in Fort Walton Beach. We then headed to Daytona Beach, where more than 160 Water-based Inspectors participated in the tagging program. Concurrently, classes were conducted with 50-60 Contractor license holders. Our Tagging event concluded in Coral Springs, with 70 Water-based Inspectors enthusiastically embracing this popular program.

Oklahoma Legislation 2024 - Bills of Interest

NFSA is monitoring the following Oklahoma Legislative Bills that were introduced in 2023 and carried over to the upcoming 2024 Legislative Session.

• **SB 652** - Professions and occupations; adding nonprofit organizations to exclusions.

Bill Analysis SB 652 exempts any nonprofit organization and its volunteers performing plumbing installations, mechanical installations, or electrical installations for a single-family dwelling unit from the provisions of the Plumbing License Law of 1955, Mechanical Licensing Act, and the Electrical License Act, respectively.

• SB 387 - Sales Tax Exemption for Certain Goods and Services for Construction of Nonprofit Facility

Engrossed SB387 provides a sales tax exemption for sales and services consumed for the construction of a facility placed in service in 2023. The exemption extends to any person, entity, contractor or subcontractor that has entered into a construction contract with the organization building the facility. For purchases and services consumed prior to the effective date of the act, the Oklahoma Tax Commission is directed to issue refunds to the purchasers in the full amount of sales tax paid.

• SB 1444 and House 1367 – Occupational Licensing: This year, these bills will NOT impact occupational licensing and will only deal with cosmetology. All Occupational License renewals and new licenses will be reviewed more in the future.

• **SB 1572** is another attempt by the electricians and IEC to change what the alarm and locksmith industry can do. The Oklahoma Alarm Industry is requesting legislators to remove the word "alarm".

• **HB 3823** is an act relating to electronics, creating the Oklahoma Electronics Owner Right to Repair Act.


